Joining The Abbey

1. Visit

To decide if The Abbey is the right school for your daughter, we invite you to come and visit us. Ideally this should be at least one year prior to entry.

We hold Open Events every term. We also offer Stay & Play sessions giving toddlers the opportunity to experience the Nursery.

2. Register

Registration can be completed online via the Admissions section of the website.

We require a non-refundable £100 fee (£250 overseas). It is advisable to register early in the Autumn Term for a place the following September.

Once you are registered we will keep you updated with the next steps.

3. Assessment

The assessment process ensures that your daughter can fully access the curriculum and have the potential to thrive in, and contribute to, the School.

In addition to academic ability and potential, we look for a range of qualities and skills which your daughter might contribute to life at The Abbey.

Entry assessments vary from informal play sessions to more traditional interview and examination settings, depending on the stage at which your daughter would enter the School and we hold informal interviews for prospective entrants to the Senior School and Sixth Form.

4. Offer & Acceptance

Once you receive the offer of a place for your daughter, please return the Form of Acceptance with a £1,000 deposit.

£500 will be deducted from the first term's fee invoice and the remaining £500 will be held for the duration of your daughter's time at the School, then refunded.

We will keep you up to date with details about familiarisation events for both you and your daughter and information to help you prepare for her first day.

A day at The Abbey

Fees 2021-22



Junior School 'Kiss and Drop'


We operate a 'Kiss and Drop' zone for girls from Reception to Lower III (Year 6) in Vicarage Road.

Bursaries

What is a Bursary?

Bursaries are provided to assist Senior School students who would benefit significantly from an education at The Abbey and whose parents could not otherwise afford to send them. Bursaries are means-tested and parental assets and income are assessed and reviewed on an annual basis. Every case will be taken on its individual merits but, among those who qualify financially, the academic potential of the student will be the overriding factor. Financial awards are not available to Junior School students.

Scholarships

Scholarships are awarded in the Senior School to recognise excellence. The prestige in recognition of a girl's ability is considerable and Scholars are expected to demonstrate commitment and enthusiasm throughout their school life. Financial awards are not available at the Junior School.





Specialist Scholarships

Specialist Scholars benefit from an enrichment programme in their subject area with access to workshops and mentoring. Specialist Scholarships in Art, Drama, Music and Sport are offered to pupils joining the Senior School in Upper III (Year 7) and are awarded for three years until the end of Upper IV (Year 9).

Assessment

The assessment process for awards varies according to the specialism. A specialist award may be held in conjunction with an Academic Scholarship but generally not in conjunction with another specialist award.

Assessments for Year 7 entry take place at the time of the entrance examination and awards are conditional upon achieving the required academic standard for each entry. Sixth Form Specialist Scholarships are awarded in the Autumn Term prior to entry in the following September and are awarded for the two years in the Sixth Form.



Sport Scholarship

The Sports Scholarship programme aims to provide a supportive environment; allowing our athletes to focus on their training and balance their academic studies. It is unique to each student with some athletes receiving strength and conditioning sessions and others receiving individual training sessions and mentoring. In previous years our Sports Scholars have attended a talent development day at Bath University, providing them with an insight into the life of a full time athlete. Scholars are fully committed to School sport and are key members of our teams, supporting the School in competition at Regional and National level across numerous sports. We are incredibly proud of all that our Scholars achieve and their contribution to life at The Abbey!

Drama Scholarship

The Drama Scholarship aims to stretch and challenge our most talented performers, who are awarded the scholarship after a rigorous audition process. As part of the award they work with our Theatre-Artist-in-Residence, as well as members of the department, to develop their skills through a varied programme of workshops and rehearsals. Drama Scholars perform at least once every other year in a Drama Scholars' play, which aims to expose the students to innovative forms of theatre. They are also provided with a workshop by an external theatre company or practitioner; recent workshops have included puppetry, playwrighting, and performing Shakespeare. Additionally, they attend a trip to the theatre free of charge. Drama Scholars are key members of the department, and regularly take part in other performance opportunities, demonstrating their talent and commitment to the wider dramatic community.


Music Scholarship

Music Scholars are key members of our musical ensembles, bands and choirs. They perform as soloists in our annual Scholars' Concert, in which they benefit greatly from preparing an advanced piece with a member of the Music Department. As part of the programme we work with the Scholar's instrumental or vocal teacher to ensure that the most suitable support can be provided for their individual musical development. Chamber music opportunities for all Scholars are plentiful. The Abbey is the only School in Reading that offers IB and A-level Music to students. We are proud to continue offering this important subject to such a high standard.

Art Scholarship

Art Scholars have the opportunity to explore and develop their interests within Art through the programme in a variety of ways. Individual aspirations are supported through mentoring and guidance. The art scholars work with professional artists, visit places of interest and exhibit annually in the School's gallery. Workshops and trips take place on at least one Saturday per term and Art studios are open weekly for Scholars to pursue their interests in the media of their choice. The programme is supportive and challenging and seeks to ensure those with a genuine and committed passion for the visual arts have an opportunity to thrive.





Sixth Form

The Abbey offers a choice of two qualifications to Sixth Form students, the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme and A Levels. Students choosing either option will study and relax alongside one another, enjoying their independence in our dedicated Sixth Form community.

International Baccalaureate and A Level programmes

The Abbey is proud to be one of the few schools in Reading to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB). Over the past five years our students have averaged 39-40 points, well above the world average of 29-30 points. In recent years we have had several students who have achieved 45 points placing them in the very top echelon globally.

IB students choose six subjects from a wide range of options (including a Modern Foreign or Classical Language, a Science, English and Mathematics). At the end of the course they sit exams in each subject, three at higher level and three at standard level.

In addition, all Diploma students complete an extended essay, follow a Theory of Knowledge (TOK) course, and take part in the Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) module.






Our experience has shown that taking the IB will provide an excellent grounding for further study at university, as well as offering an awareness of other languages and cultures, which is invaluable in an increasingly globalised world.

We also offer a wide range of A Level courses, taught to an exceptionally high standard, offering students choice and depth.

Students start with three subjects unless they take Further Mathematics. Decisions about subject choices are not rushed; we give students the time, advice and support they need when making their choices so that every student can approach her A Level programme with confidence and enthusiasm.

The Abbey has an enviable reputation for placing students at top universities, both in the UK and internationally, where they achieve outstanding results.
